### "They Called Her 'Reckless'" Author Janet Barrett

When the U.S. Marine Fifth Regiment's Recoilless Rifle Platoon acquired, in October 1952, a small Korean pony to haul ammunition up the steep hills to the front line, what they got was a real-life hero and they called her "Reckless." This courageous and indomitable warhorse stood by her buddies for two years during the Korean war, saving many lives, raising spirits, and winning the love and respect of all who know her. Join us on Wednesday evening, November 8th, as Janet Barrett shares the true story of war, love and one extraordinary horse, made possible by the contribution of more than 60 Marines who shared their memories of *Reckless* from Korea and thereafter. By turns

awe-inspiring, heartwarming, and downright funny, "They Called Her 'Reckless'" tells of an incredible human-horse connection, and the power it unleashed.

#### Women Of The Lyman Allyn Art Museum

#### Wednesday November 15 from 1:00 to 2:30

On Wednesday November 15 from 1:00 to 2:30, Tanya P., Curator of Special Projects at the Lyman Allyn Art Museum will conduct a special program for our AAUW members. It will introduce the museum to new patrons and show a different side of the museum to even inveterate visitors. We are AAUW and our focus is enabling women to be the best they can be; she will show us how many women did that at the Lyman Allyn.

She will begin with a short talk using slides in the auditorium and follow that with some time with us in the galleries. [How nice to have an extremely qualified curator who is also considerate enough to think that just going from art work to art work may be much less comfortable than some sitting before some standing!]

Following our cultural theme, she will focus on contributions that women have made to the Lyman Allyn Art Museum in all sorts of ways. We know it was founded by a woman, we know some subjects are women, we know some benefactors [we think of our own Barbara S.]. and Tanya P. is living proof of women as key experts at the museum. Fortunately, she will show us a bit more and create a context for us to focus on some examples.

A donation of \$10/person will cover costs. You can give the money to me the day of the tour [I will pay in advance based on your registration.]

## AAUW FUNDS

# AAUW FUNDS - Unraveling Where our Dollars Go

Over the next few months, I will try to help us better understand where are donations to AAUW could go.

The 2016 financial statement speaks to two financial entities, American Association of University Women which is the 501(c)3 portion and the AAUW Action Fund which is a 501(c)4 portion. Most of AAUW's programs fall under the 501(c)3 American Association of University Women which covers American and International fellowships, research resulting in reports such as *Barriers and Bias: the Status of Women in Leadership*, and many projects such as Tech Savvy, Tech Trek, Eleanor Roosevelt Fund, NCCWSL, Work Smart, the Legal Advocacy Fund (LAF), plus meetings and conventions, outreach, and advocacy. The 501(c)4 The Action Fund is the public policy lobbying arm of AAUW for which Barbara H. is our branch contact.

Donated funds can be specified as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted. Temporarily restricted funds have specific time limits to them. So, if a donation is made outside of the temporarily restricted fund time period, the donation will automatically be categorized as unrestricted. The organization prefers unrestricted donations so they can move them to the highest need. We should feel confident that our donations are well spent since GuideStar gives AAUW a gold rating for transparency and during 2016 only 18% of its \$21M in expenses went to management and development. \$18M, 82%. went to directly support the mission "to advance equity for women and girls through advocacy, education, philanthropy, and research".
