SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE

The Scholarship Committee has begun advertising for the educational grants for academic year 2014-2015. Press releases were issued to local newspapers, both hardcopy and electronic, and flyers have been posted in public places within our geographic area. Additionally, flyers were distributed for posting at Middlesex Community College and Three Rivers Community College. A copy of the flyer is attached to this newsletter.

We anticipate being able to award grants to two qualifying students in the amount of \$1000 each per semester, for a total annual expenditure of \$4000. Applicants must be 21 years of age or older, reside within our geographic area, and be pursuing an Associate or Bachelor degree from an accredited college or university. Recipients will be chosen on the basis of personal goals, academic performance, and financial need. Applications must be postmarked by June 16th. Awards will be announced by July 15th.
