It is with much sadness that I inform the Branch Members of the passing of a good friend and colleague. Carol Roche Virostek, born April 23, 1942, died on September 16, 2014 at 4:55 AM. Carol's obituary will appear in the Hartford, New Britain, Worcester and Webster newspapers. Her wake and burial will be in Massachusetts, however, there will be a celebration of Carol's life and legacy to be held at a later date, possibly at CCSU. Our dynamic speaker is Dr. Marcia McGowan, Distinguished Professor Emerita, English, Women's and Gender Studies, Eastern Connecticut State University.

Dr. McGowan will enlighten us about "Mary Borden: One of the Many Unsung Female Heroes of World War I".

Dr. Marcia Phillips McGowan graduated from Connecticut College cum laude and Phi Beta Kappa. She subsequently earned her M.A. and PhD. in English from Rutgers University. Dr. McGowan taught at Eastern Connecticut State University for over 30 years, was a founder of its Women's Studies Program and served as its Director until her retirement. She was chosen as Eastern's first faculty recipient of the Ella T. Grasso Distinguished Service Award for her leadership and contribution towards advancing women's rights and issues of gender equity. Dr. McGowan's research and publication efforts have primarily been centered on women's issues and on women writers-- whether American, English or Central American--whose achievements have been overlooked in the traditional literary canon. Her early work on the late novels of Wharton led to a particular interest in women writers whose poetry and fiction on the topic of war have been neglected.

On October 3rd, AAUW is hosting a conference at Trinity College which deals with Campus Sexual Assault. It runs from 10AM-3PM. Admission is free and lunch will be provided. From 9AM-10AM there will be a Branch Leadership Meeting, however all are welcome. Come join us. If you have any questions feel free to contact me.

Book Talk and Signing Acton Public Library Wednesday October 8th 2014 at 4 PM

The Title of the Book is *Love Letters to and from a Monk, My Aunt's Letters and His Responses* edited by Suzanne T.

About the Book

The letters begin when my Aunt, a professor at Central Connecticut State University, wrote to inform Rev. Bonnell Spencer, an Episcopalian monk, of the death of her husband, who had been his Williams college roommate. Thus began a 20 year relationship highlighted by numerous letters written after her husband's death in 1974 at the age of 70. They are most unusual for they not only are her letters to him, but his responses to her. As time passed they developed a deep feeling for each other, while often having the opportunity to meet in many exotic places around the world. His letters and her responses from his 5 year stint in Ghana training seminarians reveal a rare look into a different life in Africa.
