SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE

The Scholarship Committee is pleased to announce that it has selected the following two young women to receive our branch's educational grants for academic year 2014-2015. Both women were selected from a pool of strong applicants and were each awarded \$2000 grants, of which \$1000 has already been presented to cover the fall semester.

Amanda – Amanda is a second year student at Middlesex Community College where she expects to receive an AS degree and was amongst 19 students out of 200 who were accepted into the radiology technician program. She has a 3.2 GPA and will take three courses in the fall semester for a total of 6 credits. She is 22 y-o, lives in East Haddam with her family, and works part-time as a pharmacy technician in a local pharmacy.

Briana – Briana attends Southern Connecticut State University and is majoring in art education with the goal of becoming an art teacher. She expects to earn her BA degree in May 2016. She is 24 y-o, lives in Deep River with a family member, and has supported herself by working as a waitress.

MEETING MINUTES

AAUW General Membership Meeting May 14, 2014 Acton Public Library

President Mary M. called the meeting to order at 7:18 PM. Although there was not a quorum present – 24 were in attendance – it was decided to go ahead and have the business meeting.

Secretary's Minutes –A motion to approve the March 5, 2014 minutes as they appeared in the newsletter was made by Ann B., seconded by Nancy F. Motion was approved.

Treasurer's Report – Dot handed out an itemized accounting of funds. The current balance is \$29,592.32 and gave a summary of the Fundraiser. The board suggested the funds be split 40% for AAUW Funds and 60% for our local grant/scholarship program. Carolyn C. made a motion that the funds from the fundraiser be split as

the board suggested. Suzanne T. seconded. Motion carried.

\$3648 from the fundraiser will be distributed to AAUW Funds. As there are many different AAUW Funds Mary Ann K. made a motion that a committee decide which funds we will give to. Motion 2nd by Barbara H.. Motion carried. A committee headed by Mary Ann will report back to the group at the end of the summer.

Mary Ann discussed our branch relationship with Middlesex Community College and Eva Jones who is a professor there. Eva is interested in **Start Smart** training that helps women negotiate salaries when they start a job. Sally Keating made a motion, seconded by Dot B. that we give \$100 to Eva Jones to attend the training. Motion passed.

Treasurer Dot B. discussed the budget. Mary Lu made a motion to accept the budget as presented and Barbara H. seconded. Those in attendance accepted the budget but because there was not a quorum we will open it for a binding vote in Sept.

Programs –Carolyn C. discussed our June 11th meeting at the Ivoryton. The show will be **Fingers** and **Toes.** Tickets are \$30 per person. You may invite a guest. We have \$65 seats reserved. The play is at 7:30 with Happy Hour starting at 6:30.

Carolyn will head the **Programs Committee** for next year and will have a committee to assist her. Anyone interested in being on the committee should let Carolyn know.

Newsletter and Website- The website is up and we thank Eva B. for all her work getting this started.

Scholarship and NCCWSL – Rose P. was not present. Nancy F. spoke for the committee. We will be giving 2 \$2000 grants for the fall semester. The flyers have been printed and distributed. Erma has contacted the local newspapers. June 16 the applications are due. July 15 they will determine who receives them. The present winners can reapply. The applications are judged on financial, academic, personal goals and references. We sponsored 2 students from Middlesex to NCCWSL. Interest Groups
