## SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE

The Scholarship Committee is pleased to announce that two young women were selected to receive our branch's educational grants for academic year 2016-2017. Each student was awarded a \$2000 grant, of which \$1000 has already been presented to cover the fall semester. An additional \$1000 will be presented at a later date to cover the spring semester. Congratulations to the following students.

**Megan** – This is the second year that Megan has received an educational grant from our branch. She is a senior at the University of Connecticut and is majoring in English at the Neag School of Education. She is interested in either becoming an English teacher or pursuing a career in marketing that would allow her to use both her writing and communication skills. Her concentration is in creative writing and her minor is communication. During the summer, she interned as a writer in the marketing department at Cigna Health Corporation which allowed her to understand a business environment. At UCONN, Megan is a member of the National Society of Leadership and Success (Sigma Alpha Pi) and the Creative Writing Club. She is taking five courses in the fall semester and anticipates earning a Bachelor degree in English in May 2017. She maintatins a 3.5 GPA. Megan is 23 years old and resides in Lyme.

Viktoria – Viktoria is a sophomore at Elon University in North Carolina and is majoring in Acting and Liberal Music Arts with a minor in Dance. On November 1, 2016, 14 members have signed up to travel to New York for the 9/11 Memorial Guided Tour and Museum Visit.

We have **one extra ticket** which will be assigned to the first member who contacts me.

"The 9/11 Memorial is a place of remembrance and quiet reflection."

The group will take a Shoreline East Train around 7:50 a.m. from either Old Saybrook, Westbrook or any of the stops along the way to New Haven. We will take a Metro North Train from New Haven to Grand Central Station, arriving around 10:40 a.m.

Groups can decide to take a taxi or 2 subways from Grand Central to the 9/11 Museum. It is at least a 20 minute ride.

Our tour begins promptly at **noon** outside the museum. We need to be there at least **10 minutes before the start time**. The tour takes about 45 minutes (rain or shine) and ends at the museum entrance. Each person will use her ticket for entry into the museum. There will be a security check and no museum re-entry is permitted.

The senior tickets are \$34.09 (includes tax). I will plan on giving the tickets to those signed up - at our Oct. AAUW Meeting.

We will spend a couple of hours in the museum visiting the various displays of the 9/11 day. There is a cafe in the museum where we will have lunch.

When I get the **new Fall Shoreline East Schedule**, I will update Train times. We will leave the museum around 3:30 - 4:00.

An approximate 4:45 train from Grand Central gets us into New Haven around 6:30; an approximate 6:40 Shoreline East Train gets us into Westbrook at 7:17; and Old Saybrook at 7:23.

If anyone who has signed up can't make the trip, please contact me ASAP so that I can make the trip available to any other interested members.
