Our five recipients of the Alan Spargo Memorial Women Scholarship NCCWSL for remain scheduled to attend the National Conference for College Women Student Leaders on May 27-30 at the University of Maryland, College Park campus. In line with federal guidance regarding the coronavirus, AAUW is concerned about spreading the virus and is closely monitoring the situation by communicating with numerous stakeholders. The Scholarship Committee has begun advertising for education grants for the 2020-2021 academic year. Applicants must be at least 20 years old, be pursuing an Associate or Bachelor degree, and reside within the geographic area serviced by our branch.
