SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE

The Scholarship Committee has selected three women to receive education grants for the upcoming academic year, 2020-2021.

Two students were awarded \$2000 grants which will cover two semesters, and one student was awarded a \$1000 grant to cover her final semester before graduating.

Congratulations to the following students:

Kelsey D. – Kelsey is a junior at Purdue University and is pursuing a BS degree in Animal Sciences. She earned a spot as a member of the Veterinary Scholars Program which allows her to complete her degree in three years and then enter Purdue's Veterinary School to pursue a Doctorate in Veterinary Medicine. Her goal is to perform animal surgery and to find a way to reduce costs so that an "animal's life rests in the hands of how much their owners care, not how much is in their wallet."

For two years, Kelsey worked part-time as a veterinary assistant and currently works on campus as a back milker, moving groups of cows in and out of the milking parlor.

One of her instructors describes her as 'hardworking by nature'. Aside from her academic success, she demonstrates strong leadership skills as she was recently voted to be President of Purdue Crew, a 120-person rowing team.

Juliette L – Juliette is currently attending Seton Hall University as a junior, majoring in Early Childhood Education with a Concentration in Speech and Language Pathology and Spanish. She is bilingual and aspires to a career as a Bilingual Speech and Language Pathologist, working with young learners who struggle with language. She wants to provide them "a clear voice and expansive vocabulary to courageously change their ability to learn, progress, and improve themselves."

Upon graduation in 2022, Juliette plans to enter a MA program. She is a member of the International Honor Society in Education, Seton Hall Dance Team, Latin Dance Club, Buccino Leadership Institute, and Cuban American Alliance for Leadership where she is a college mentee for cultural and professional leadership advancement. She has volunteer experience in numerous capacities and has been involved in community service activities dating back to high school.

Tabitha R. – Tabitha is a 35 years old mother with two young daughters and a husband. She holds a BS degree in Biology and Marine Sciences from the University of Tampa in 2008. Since her husband is not working due to medical issues, she works as a licensed Veterinary Technician to support the family. Her goal is to become a licensed Registered Nurse.

Along with a limited number of students, Tabitha was accepted into the accelerated nursing program at UCONN at Avery Point. This is a three-semester program that began in Spring 2020 and will complete in Fall 2020. One of her professors describes her as "bringing a wealth of experience and emotional maturity to the profession."

Tabitha is a student who is balancing motherhood, a part-time job, and full-time course work. After graduation and working in the field, Tabitha would like to pursue a MS degree leading to becoming an APRN.

Due to the pandemic, it was not possible this year for Committee members to meet these students over lunch and present their awards in person. The awards were mailed. They, however, are invited to meet the branch at our Annual Tea in January 2021.

We note that all three students are truly deserving of our awards as they excel academically, have an impressive set of goals, and clear financial need.
