October 14, 2020**

This branch meeting, held via Zoom, began at 7:20 pm. There were 24 members in attendance.

Our Speaker

Program Chair Gerri Smith introduced our speaker, Patricia Sisson, who spoke on “Your Part in Solving the Climate Crisis.” Before her retirement, Patti was a teacher at Middletown High School, where she started the Environmental Club. She is a graduate of the University of California-Davis and holds a Masters’ degree from Wesleyan University.

A member of the Climate Reality Leadership Corps, she attended Al Gore’s 2017 conference on climate change and greenhouse gases. She gave a PowerPoint presentation covering the broad range of environmental issues that relate to global warming, and she took questions afterward. Gerri will prepare a blast e-mail with Patti’s contact info and other links on the subject.

President’s Remarks

At 8:20 pm, President Mary Jane Peterson called the business meeting to order and welcomed everyone to LCV’s first branch business meeting since March. She reminded members that the next branch meeting will be

held on November 4, not on November 11 (which is Veterans’ Day).

She said that our branch is trying to hold as many outdoor events as we can under current circumstances, such as the recent tour of the Studio 80 Sculpture Grounds in Old Lyme. The September outdoor meeting at Fireman’s Field featured a speaker from the League of Women’s Voters. Krista May has volunteered to take members to the polls if needed.

Mary Jane gave special thanks to Margie Rice for producing the Directory and to Kristen Owens for getting the blast messages and newsletters out to members in a timely manner.

Business Meeting

Secretary’s Report

A motion was made by Dawn Boulanger and seconded by Linda Frigon to approve the minutes of the Business Meeting of September 9, 2020 as presented. The motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer’s Report

Linda Frigon gave the Treasurer’s report as of September 31, 2020. There is a balance of \$5,922.86 in the Business Advantage Checking account. The deposits in this account were from member dues, the monthly donation to the Alan Spargo fund, and the return of the deposit check by Clarks Field. There was also \$465.80 in new donations.

Expenses included Luncheon refunds and dues owed to National. Outstanding checks totaling \$323.80 were for Luncheon refunds, the October speaker honorarium, and the printing of the Directories.

The Business Money Market Account (combined Bequest and Business Savings Accounts) balance is \$21,462.99, of which \$15,000 is unavailable for use, and \$2,000 has been allocated for January grants. The ending balance was \$21,462.99.

The full Treasurer’s Report has been put on file for audit.

Committee Reports

Programs.

Chairperson Gerri Smith noted that due to Veteran’s Day, there is a date change for the November meeting from November 11 to November 4—the day after the election.

A speaker from the Connecticut Women’s Hall of Fame will give a virtual presentation on “The Women’s Vote.” Membership.

Mary Jane said Margie Rice and Sharon Howell report that our branch currently has 92 paid members.

Scholarships.

Chair Rose Petersen announced that the Scholarship Committee will meet again in early November.

They will be proceeding under the assumption that our branch will be offering educational grants of \$2,000 each. However, the number of students we will be able to fund is unknown at this time.

Our three educational grant recipients will be invited to our January branch meeting; it will be nice for our members to meet them, even if virtually.

Communications.

Co-Chair Kristen Owens has been filing news sent to her for the November newsletter.

She will send an email asking for any other information to be sent to her by October 28, but requests that members send info to her as soon as it is available.

Chair Deb DeHertogh reported that 17 members attended the outdoor guided tour of the Studio 80 Sculpture Grounds in Old Lyme.

On October 28, there will be a hike at Wadsworth Falls State Park in Middletown.

Deb is working with our new member Jackie Fastaia, a docent at the New Britain Museum of Art, regarding our group visiting the museum under whatever rules now exist (such as in small groups, staggered times, etc.).

Great Decisions.

The group will discuss the relationship between the United States and the Philippines on Wednesday, October 21.

Book Groups.

Deb DeHertogh said the evening group's book for November is Country Girls by Edna O'Brien.

Sara Keaney said the afternoon group's book for November is Never Let Me Go, by Kazuo Ishiguro.

The group had intended to read the anthology, Lives of the Suffragettes, edited by MJ Rose and our former Authors' Luncheon speaker Fiona Davis, for the November meeting the day after the Election. However, the book is not available until October 27, leaving too little time for the group to read it. It is rescheduled for December so we can commemorate the 100th anniversary of the 19th Amendment.
