Steps to Donating to our LCV Branch:

Go to our website https://lowerctvalley-ct.aauw.net Click on the yellow "Donate Button" on right side of the page.

A donation page will come up.

1. Choose the amount of the donation

2. Choose where you would like the money to go. your choices are:

a. Undergraduate Grants & Scholarshipsb. Recognition Fund "in honor of" or "in memory of"

c. LCV Programs or Functions

3. Choose if you would like to add to your donation to help offset the cost of processing fee (ex. For a \$25 donation it would be \$1.25). If you do this you will be donating \$25 to LCV and paying the \$1.25 processing fee.

4. Choose "Donate with PayPal" or "Donate with a Debit or Credit Card"

5. On the payment page you can write a note:

a. To identify who the donation is "In memory of" or "in honor of". Please include if you want someone to be notified of the gift. If so, include their name and their address (email or mailing address)

b. If you are doing "in memory" or "in honor of" please write in where you want the money to go – Grants & Scholarships or LCV programs & functions.

6. Fill in your payment information

a. Please add your contact information so we can contact you with any questions and/or send a thank you for the gift

b. Click on "Donate Now" and you are done.
