Judith led our discussion about Angela Merkel's youth in East Germany, her education as a scientist, her working relationships with world leaders including several American presidents and Vladimir Putin, her reputation as a calm and persistent negotiator, and her legacy in Germany and across the world.

We were all impressed with Merkel's accomplishments in her sixteen years as German Chancellor. Many thanks to Judith for her revealing presentation of the book's critical reception, interesting facts about the biographer's life, and differing reviews of the book. Judith's questions spurred our discussion, leading to a fascinating meeting.
