June 2020, Bernstein became CEO and National Director of the <u>Community Security Service</u> (CSS), an American nonprofit prividing security to the US Jewish community through trained community volunteers.

In 2021, he was selected to <u>The</u> <u>Algemeiner</u>'s lis of "Top 100 People Positively Influencing Jewish Life".

In 2022, Bernstein co-founded the Interfaith Security Council, a coalition of New York City faith-based organizations that promote communal security and multifaith dialogue.

A graduate of Western CT State University, Evan has a Masters of Liberal Arts from Harvard University. He is a native of East Lyme and his mother, Carole Otto, is an LCV AAUW member.

AFTERNOON BOOK GROUP

The Afternoon Book Group met on Wednesday, September 6th to discuss Master Slave Husband Wife by Ilyon Woo, an historical book chronicling the escape of a married enslaved couple, Ellen and William Craft. Via careful planning, physical disguises, improvisation, and luck, they traveled from Macon, Georgia, to Philadelphia and Boston. Despite their safe arrival in the North, the Crafts were targeted by Southerners following the Fugitive Slave Law. They later settled in England. Working with abolitionists Frederick Douglas and William Wells Brown, the Crafts became celebrated lecturers, admired across the world. Members agreed we learned so much about the years before the Civil War and the figures of Abolitionism. Woo's book effortlessly wove together the Crafts' escape from slavery with background events in the North, South, and Europe. We had a lively and informative discussion.

Our next meeting will be Wednesday, October 4th at 1 p.m. on Zoom. MaryAnn Iadorola and Elaine Quayle will lead our discussion of *The Librarianist* by Patrick deWitt, a novel about Bob Comet, a retired librarian who lives a quiet life until he encounters a resident of a senior center, begins to volunteer there, and opens up about his life.

The book for our November 1st meeting will be *Tomorrow and Tomorrow and Tomorrow*, by Gabrielle Zevin, about a couple's life-long friendship. It follows them from childhood to college to their collaboration to create video games-- a memorable portrait of friendship. Judith Slisz will lead our discussion.

Our December 6th meeting will be a discussion of the novel *Hello Beautiful*, by Ann Napolitano, a contemporary family story that echoes *Little Women* in

its portrayal of four sisters. If you would be willing to lead this discussion, let us know. We would be happy to provide you with background information and discussion questions.
