The Book Author Luncheon fundraiser is scheduled for **Saturday, April 13, 2024**, from 11:30-3pm, at the Saybrook Point Inn. We've two great women authors already booked for this event – Denny Bryce and Adele Myers. Both authors will have new books coming out before the Luncheon.

BOOK AUTHOR LUNCHEON (BAL) -UPDATES:

BAL Committee has already met with Saybrook Inn; Donation/Auction committee soliciting businesses

Deb DeHertogh, Penny Hein, and Linda Frigon met with the Saybrook Point Inn event staff to discuss ways to make the 2024 Book Author Luncheon even better. The Donation and Auction committee has met and begun soliciting seasonal businesses that close during the winter months. Book Author Luncheon Ticket Price Increase

The actual expenses cost per person for the Luncheon is \$64.18 (which covers the \$999.00 venue rental, luncheon price, taxes, and gratuities). To ensure we can fund our Educational Scholarships, the Board has set the price at \$75.00 per ticket (so approximately \$10 of each ticket will now go directly to scholarships.) This is comparable to many other local fundraisers (due to rising costs of food, staff etc.) We will also be offering a **Patron Ticket** for \$125 -- which includes two drinks and \$10 in raffle tickets. (Last year, ALL profits from ticket sales came from Patron Tickets, as the \$65 ticket just covered our expenses.)

Book Author Luncheon Corporate Sponsors

Corporate Sponsorships proved to be our most profitable fundraiser in 2023. Several members worked with organizations, and local businesses, with whom they had a personal relationship (financial advisors, general contractors etc.). This 2024 year we hope to expand on this concept.
