Book: The Sweetness of Water, by Nathan Harris

The Afternoon Book Group met recently to discuss *Under the Skin: The Hidden Toll of Racism on American Lives and on the Health of Our Nation*, by Linda Villarosa. This non-fiction book opened many topics for our discussion led by Mary Jane Peterson. The author blended her own experiences, as the editor of Essence magazine and the New York Times Health section, with her family's health challenges in childbirth and hospital treatment. All reflecting the institutional racism in the American health care system.

Linda Villarosa combined real life examples of racism in medical care, with supporting data, providing a view of the still-present systemic racism. We benefited from the views of several members of our book group who are health-care professionals, which gave us a deeper understanding of the book. Thank you, Mary Jane, for leading this memorable discussion!

Our next meeting will be Wednesday, March 6<sup>th</sup>. We will discuss *The Sweetness of Water*, by Nathan Harris, a novel set after the end of the Civil War in Georgia, following the emancipation of brothers and the family that had enslaved them. This debut novel received much acclaim when it was published last year.

Our April book will be *Yellowface*, by R.F. Kuang; and our May book will be *The Wind Knows My Name*, by Isabel Allende. In June, we will meet with the Evening Book Group to discuss *The First Ladies*, by Marie Benedict and Victoria Christopher Murray.
