# **AFTERNOON BOOK GROUP**

The Afternoon Book Group met on Wednesday, September 4th to discuss James by Percival Everett, a retelling of The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn from the point of view of Huck's enslaved companion, Jim. Thanks to Elaine Quayle who provided a biography of Percival Everett, a prolific author whose work defies categories. Most of us hadn't read anything else by Everett, but some were familiar with the recent film American Fiction based on his novel Erasure. We agreed that we would like to read more of his works. In our discussion, we talked about the many issues explored in James including the use of codeswitching by enslaved characters, the author's use of and departure from Twain's plot, and the relevance of the novel to our current world. Many of us read reviews and interviews about James and learned many fascinating things about the author and this novel. Upcoming novels include:

*The Ukrainian Night: An Intimate History of Revolution* by Marci Shore -- a history of the 2013-2014 uprising on the Maidan which began the Ukrainian resistance to the Russian invasion. Judith Slisz will lead the discussion.

An Unfinished Love Story: A Personal History of the 1960s by Doris Kearns Goodwin --Dick and Doris Goodwin were married for 42 years and witnessed important moments of American history through their work with John F.
