<u>Safe Futures Talk:</u> Jan Furman introduced our guest speaker, Nazmie Ojeda, for the evening representing Safe Futures in New London, CT. Her topic was "Domestic Violence Update: What's New?" Nazmie shared the following highlights of the Safe futures program:

- Direct service is given to victims of domestic violence and sexual abuse.
- Needed support and resources are supplied to victims.
- Educational instruction is available for victims.
- Service is free.
- Emergency shelter is available.
- The agency is pet friendly.
- One in three teens experience some form of intimate dating violence.
- Only 33% of teens who experience dating violence report it.
- Physical, verbal, sexual, technological and stalking are types of abuse.

Nazmie's presentation was well received by members. Jeannette reminded us that we collect for Safe Futures in November and that gift cards, toiletries, and money donations are accepted.
