#### AFTERNOON BOOK CLUB

Date: Wednesday, November 6 Time: 1:00pm Location: via Zoom Book: An Unfinished Love Story: A Personal History of the 1960s by Doris Kearns Goodwin

The Afternoon Book Group met on Wednesday, October 2nd to discuss *The Ukrainian Night:*  *An Intimate History of Revolution* by Marci Shore, a historian of European intellectual history at Yale.

Our discussion leader, Judith Slisz, helped us review the events of the 2013-2014 revolution at the Maidan or Independence Square in Kyiv. We found the book's method a bit confusing as it presented the revolution through the varied experiences of many different people-- all committed to protesting the election fraud and corruption of the country's leaders. We found it illuminating to understand the complicated ethnic and linguistic Ukrainian identities. Of course, the 2014 Maidan revolution preceded the recent Russian invasion; learning about this earlier revolution helped us appreciate the determination of the Ukrainian people in their current struggles. Many members of our group shared additional research which answered questions about this complex country's history. Many thanks to Judith for leading this thoughtprovoking discussion!

Our next meeting will be on November 6th at 1 p.m. on Zoom when we will talk about-- An Unfinished Love Story: A Personal History of the 1960s by Doris Kearns Goodwin-- Dick and Doris Goodwin were married for 42 years and witnessed important moments of American history through their work with John F. Kennedy, LBJ, Robert Kennedy, Martin Luther King, Jr and their involvement in pivotal events in 20th century history. Dot Beaulieu will lead the discussion.

Looking ahead, our book for the December 4th meeting will be *This Other Eden* by **Paul Harding**, a novel about an isolated mixed-race community on an island off the Maine coast.

We hope you can join us soon. Until then, happy reading!
