ESP FINANCIAL REPORT

We have been very fortunate this past year to receive donations from some of our incredibly generous members. With these substantial contributions we currently have \$84,234 in our M&T Bank Accounts. We will pay out \$12,000 in scholarships at the January Tea and approximately \$6,000 for college students to attend a national leadership conference at the University of Maryland in May.

The Education and Scholarship Board has also decided to place \$25,000 in reserve for a rainy-day fund so that we may pay out scholarships even if the Book Author Luncheon is cancelled at some future date. Based on our available funds for the 2025 – 2026 Fiscal Year, we plan to increase the number of scholarships given as well as evaluate other potential programs that fit within the ESP's Mission. Our mission states "to provide scholarships and educational programming with the goal of advancing equity and education for women and girls. Scholarships are provided to college women based on personal goals, academic performance, and financial need."

SCHOLARSHIP

The Scholarship Selection Committee is meeting to plan publicity for the Educational Grant program. We will begin posting information and the application in late winter. The deadline for Educational Grant applications is June 9, 2025. Eligible students must be 20 years old, reside in New London or Middlesex Counties, and be enrolled in an accredited two- or four-year college program.

We learned recently that the national AAUW has passed the organization and presentation of the National Conference for Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL) to NASPA, Student Affairs Administrators in Higher Education (www.naspa.org). We have been in contact with NASPA with questions about the upcoming conference. Book: The Lioness of Boston by Emily

Franklin

The Afternoon Book Group met on December 4th to discuss *This Other Eden* by **Paul Harding**, a novel about the 19th century mixed race colony on Maine's Malaga Island and its eventual eviction in 1912.

We learned about two other books by the author including the 2010 Pulitzer Prizewinning *Tinkers* and its sequel *Enon*, both about the life of interrelated characters in a small New England town. We also viewed the website of the Maine Coast Heritage Trust (www.mcht.org) which explained the history of Malaga Island and its current status as a conservation site that can be visited by boat for passive recreation.

Some of the topics we discussed:

- --the lyrical poetic style which sometimes overtook the plot events;
- --the use of historical documents, museum labels, and shifting points of view;
- --the influence of the eugenics movement in the early 20th century;
- --the many biblical references in characters' names and their challenges; and
- --the many colorful and memorable characters who lived on the island.

Thanks to all who attended and participated in the meeting!

Our January 8th meeting will be a discussion of *The Lioness of Boston*, a novel about the life of Isabella Stewart Gardner, who established her eponymous art museum in Boston and lived a life of independence in proper Boston. **Sara Keaney** will lead our discussion.

At the February 5th meeting we will talk about *Breaking Through: My Life in Science* by **Katalin Kariko**, a memoir by the 2023 winner of **Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine** whose research led to the COVID vaccine. **Judith Slisz** will lead the discussion.
