SCHOLARSHIP

The Scholarship Selection Committee has registered four students to attend this year's National Conference for College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL). The three day leadership conference will be held from May 28-30 at the University of Maryland at College Park. This is the first year that NASPA, Student Affairs Administrators in Higher Education (naspa.org) has taken over the conference from AAUW. The students are asked to write an evaluation of the conference when they return.

The Afternoon Book Group met on April 2nd to discuss *North Woods* by Daniel Mason, a novel about a house in the Berkshires and its various residents over centuries. Thanks to Elaine Quayle who shared the author's biography and information about the reception of his novels.

We were impressed that Mason is a practicing psychiatrist and professor at Stanford University and noted that his knowledge of human behavior and attention to detail inform his writings.

Some of the **topics we discussed** included the unique nature of the novel which features the setting of the colonial-era house which changes over time reflecting its residents; the author's versatility of style and voice, shifting from epistolary storytelling to lyrical nature descriptions to gossipy detective magazine articles; his exploration of mental illness through the experiences of a schizophrenic character; and episodes of fantasy alternating with the realism of natural descriptions.

Our book for the May 7th meeting will be When Women Ran Fifth Avenue: Glamour and Power of the Dawn of American Fashion by Julie Satow, a nonfiction book about the influence of American women executives in the New York fashion industry in from the 1930s to the present time. Time for some nostalgia about our memories of department store shopping! Deb Herskowitz will lead our discussion.

Our joint meeting with the Evening Book Group will take place on Wednesday, June 4th at 3 p.m. at Acton Library in Old Saybrook. We will discuss *The Women* by **Kristen Hannah**, a novel about the experiences of women nurses during the Vietnam war. Details will be announced soon.
