The Afternoon Book Group met on Wednesday, **May 8th** to talk about *When Women Ran Fifth Avenue: Glamour and Power at the Dawn of American Fashion* by Julie Santow, a non-fiction book about women executives at New York department stores from the Depression to the 1970s. **Deb Herskowitz** led our discussion. We were impressed that the book covered so many aspects of contemporary and popular culture of the twentieth century. The **three women-- Hortense Odlum at Bonwit Teller, Dorothy Shaver at Lord and Taylor, and Geraldine Stutz at Henri Bendel--** rose to their **executive positions amid social and economic pressures** of their times. They introduced **new ideas** about customer service, innovative store designs, and openness to original fashions, promoting and popularizing American designers. We were all interested in what we learned about the growth of department stores as they gave women opportunities in

both employment and freedom of choice as they explored the wider world and exercised their influence as consumers. We also enjoyed **sharing our memories** of visiting stores wherever we lived-- buying school clothes, being awestruck at holiday toy wonderlands, and spending our babysitting earnings on the latest fashions. Thank you, Deb, for guiding our discussion on these many subjects!

We will meet together with the Evening Book Group on Wednesday, June 4th at 3 p.m. at Acton Public Library in Old Saybrook. We will talk about *The Women* by Kristen Hannah, a novel about the experiences of women nurses in the Vietnam War and their experiences as they return to the U.S. Sara Keaney will lead the discussion.
