AFTERNOON BOOK CLUB

Book: All the Beauty in the World by Patrick

Bringley

The Afternoon Book Group met on October 1st to talk about *The Frozen River* by Ariel Lawhon, a novel about Martha Ballard, a midwife in 18th century Maine. The book centers on a few years in Martha Ballard's life including the murder of a resident found in the frozen Kennebec River, a rape trial, the many babies she delivers, and her family's life in this challenging frontier.

Many thanks to Barb Dimberg who led our discussion! Some of the topics we discussed were our admiration for Ballard and her medical expertise and extreme courage in traveling to deliver care; what we learned about the economy of early New England as we witnessed Martha's work and her pay in bartering, exchange of services as well as money; the portrait of the marriage of Martha and her husband Ephraim which we thought was depicted through modern eyes; and the author's use of Martha Ballard's diary.

Barb reminded us that another view of Martha Ballard is provided in Laurel Thatcher Ulrich's Pulitzer Prize-winning history *A Midwife's Tale: The Life of Martha Ballard, based on Her Diary*, 1785-1812. A few of us have read it. We agreed that it provides another way to understand this remarkable woman and her world. Thanks again, Barb, for a provocative discussion!

Our next books will be:

Wednesday, November 5th--All the Beauty in the World—Patrick Bringley—nonfiction—A memoir by a man who becomes a museum guard at the Metropolitan Museum of Art after the death of his brother. He finds peace amid the beauty of the art and solace in the community of other guards who come to their jobs with a range



of backgrounds and skills—artists themselves, immigrants, musicians, and writers.

Wednesday, December 3rd-- How to Read a Book—Monica Wood—fiction--A novel about the chance meeting of three people: a woman recently released from prison for a drunk-driving crash that killed a kindergarten teacher; a retired English teacher who runs a prison book group; and a man whose wife was killed by the drunk driver. A book about the power of reading to change lives.

Wednesday, January 7th--Daughters of the Bamboo Grove: From China to America, A True Story of Abduction, Adoption, and Separated Twins—Barbara Demick—nonfiction—The story of twin sisters torn apart by China's one-child policy and the rise of international adoption. The journalist/ author (who also wrote Eat the Buddha about Tibet which the Afternoon Book Group read recently) investigated the abductions of Chinese children, some of whom were adopted by American families who thought they had been abandoned. She traces the fate of one set of twins—one who remains in China, and the other who lives in Texas.

Topic: The Evolution of US Leadership in the Global Economy: Dilemmas and Choices (Topic 2 in briefing book) Leader: - Mary Jane Peterson

Under Presidents Trump and Biden, the US has embraced a post-neoliberal approach to economic policy-making. This approach relies on tariffs, export controls, unilateral economic sanctions, and other restrictive measures to a degree heretofore unseen in the postwar era. These measures have antagonized US allies and adversaries alike. In our November session, we will explore whether the US, during President Trump's second term, is able to exercise leadership in the security realm if it fails to keep the global economy open.

Several new members have expressed interest in our group; please feel free to show up and dive in or, alternately, observe! We start each meeting with a short video that summarizes the topic, making it possible for anyone to get caught up even if they don't have the topic book. We welcome all members!
